

**The Pin-MAR Antique Car Club, Inc.** is a not-for-profit corporation founded as a club in Pinellas County, Florida, in 1964. (Pin-MAR is an acronym for the Pinellas Model A Restorers) The club's founders were dedicated to restoring and preserving the Model A Ford. The club now accepts members with all makes, models, and years of vehicles. Meetings are on the first Thursday of each month at Heritage Village in the Pinellas Room or as announced in this newsletter. The club dedicates time and resources to Heritage Village, including volunteers who run the H.C. Smith General Store, care for the period garage display, and maintain the park's antique vehicles. The club also conducts tours, outings, an annual Picnic, an annual Car Show, and sponsorship of the Heritage Village General Mercantile & Garage. It's a fun, all-volunteer club for the entire family, with annual dues (Jan1-Dec 31) set at just \$20.00.



The year 2022 will be remembered as the great comeback year. The COVID-19 pandemic had diminished from a lion to a lamb as the world came out of hibernation and became active again. We had a great Birthday Tour in January, a great picnic in March, and we hosted a tremendous car show at Heritage Village in April after being on hold for a full decade. Throughout the year, we toured again, held our monthly meetings and the Classy Lassies returned with monthly luncheons. Pin-MAR is one of the oldest continually running car clubs in Florida, having been around since 1964. Think about that. In 1964, the Beatles and the Mustang were brand new. Lindon Johnson was President. A boxer named Casius Clay became the heavyweight champ. We watched The Munsters, Flipper, Gilligan's Island the and The Outer Limits on TV. The movies Goldfinger and Mary Poppins were top box office, and a movie ticket cost \$1.25. The oldest Model A Fords were only 36 years old (like a 1986 model is now). No current major league baseball player was born yet (and many of their parents). And we still have a few charter members including Rick Fraze and Tony Zeoli on the current roster.

### RUNNING ON EMPTY



Ingenuity and the Great Depression

We call them the "Greatest Generation". Those are the Americans who grew up during the Great Depression and went on to win WWII. When the stock market crashed in October of 1929, it was followed by a full decade of hard times. Today we grow concerned when unemployment exceeds 10%, but in the 1930s, it hit 25%, and that was at a time when few women worked outside the home, and most homes had one bread winner. Remember that it was WWII that put the ladies into the factories.


In the 1930s banks folded, and farms were foreclosed. People went hungry and walked the streets looking for any kind of work. Gangsters robbed gas stations, grocery stores and banks, and they made their getaway in Ford's V-8 cars. The WPA was formed to put people to work, and movie studios cranked out musicals to cheer up the dreary times. Shirley Temple and Mickey Rooney became box office stars, and expensive cars like Duesenberg, Peerless and Pierce Arrow disappeared.

This is the era of the Model A and the early Ford V-8s that many of us own today. It is the era of the Mercantile display at Heritage Village as many of the artifacts are from the 1930s. The subject of the Great Depression often comes up when I am working as a docent in the Village store. There are two stories that I share with store visitors about the ingenuity of the people living through the Great Depression.

The first story involves the flour sacks that we have on display. During the Depression, when money was scarce, many moms made clothes for their children. When there was no money for new material, then used material was recycled. A common source of material for little girl's dresses became empty flour sacks and/or feed sacks. When the flour mills and feed companies became aware of this, they began to sell flour and feed in sack materials that had nice prints, so little girls would have nicer looking dresses to wear. The accompanying photos show some examples, and such dresses are highly collectible today.

The second story revolves around our collection of tobacco tins. Once I have pointed out the fact that we have Price Albert in a can, I tell the story of the various tobacco tin sizes. Tobacco tins were available in pocket size, and two table-top sizes. During the depression, many tobacco companies started putting handles or bails onto the larger table-top size tins. Once the tin was empty of the tobacco, it then became a lunch box for school kids. Today, tobacco tins are highly collectible, and the lunch box tins have become hard to find, because of the dual life and long-term usage. Two examples of these lunchbox tins from Sherri's collection are shown in the accompanying photos.

America's Greatest Generation will never be forgotten for the many hardships that people endured during the Great Depression and for the ingenuity in dealing with those hardships. See you on the road. I'll be baking a potato on the exhaust manifold of my '40 Ford flat head V-8.

## Who says "We Ain't Got No Culture"

When I was a kid not very long ago, I would hear people say the St. Petersburg / Clearwater area had great beaches, but no other "culture." I always took that to mean no museums. Oh, there was the Museum of Fine Arts (MFA) and the Old St. Pete Historical Museum, but they were pretty meager. Now here we are going into 2023 and what changes have been made!

As a club, we support and work in one of the finest open air historical museums in the country, Heritage Village. It's next door neighbor is the Florida Botanical Gardens, a museum of nature and its wonder. Probably the top dog of course, is The Dali Museum in St. Petersburg, renowned worldwide for its art collection and architecture. A few blocks north are both the MFA and the SPHM. The MFA has grown through amazing changes and is truly a world class museum. Just east is the SPHM, with a fine collection including a replica of Tony Janus' Benoist Airboat, the first commercial airline in the world.

Right on Central Ave is the James Museum of Western & Wildlife Art and Sculpture, not to be missed. A few blocks further west is the Chihuly Collection featuring the amazing glass art of Dale Chihuly. A few blocks further west is The Imagine Museum of artglass from artists worldwide. If we wander north on 4th St. we find the brand new Museum of the American Arts and Crafts Movement.

Unique on this list and not to be missed is The Florida Holocaust Museum so we never forget one of the worst periods in human history.

We car nuts have two on our hit list. First there's the Tampa Bay Auto Museum in Pinellas Park and a bit further north in Clearwater is The Collection on Palmetto. Scattered through mid-county are the Largo Historical Museum, The Clearwater Historical Museum, Safety Harbor Historical Museum, and Palm Harbor Historical Museum. Let's not forget the Gulf Beaches Historical Museum and Indian Rocks Beach Historical Museum. Finally, up in Tarpon Springs lies the Leepa-Rattner Art Museum which houses the collection from the old Belleair Art Museum. Many of these museums are free while the others charge affordable fees.

One of the comments we hear most from visitors to Heritage Village is the disbelief that it's free. This from visitors from all over the United States, Canada, Asia, and Europe. This coming year, take a few hours to enjoy the significant art and collections we have available to us.

## RECIPE MONTH



### Hearty Kielbasa Lentil Soup

45 min | EASY | Serves 6

#### **Ingredients:**

1 lb. pkg. of lentils
2- 16 oz. cans Diced Tomatoes
2 Bay Leaves
1 and 1/2 lbs. Kielbasa, cut into 1 inch slices
8 Bacon Slices
1 cup carrots, diced or sliced into coins
1 cup sliced Celery
1 medium diced onion
Salt & pepper

#### **Directions:**

Rinse & drain lentils. Put into a large pot with 5 cups of water, with tomatoes, bay leaves, 1Tbsp. salt & 1/4 tsp. black pepper. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer for 15 minutes, then add the kielbasa. While that is simmering, in a separate pan, cook 8 slices of cut up bacon until limp. Drain all but 1 Tbsp. of the bacon fat & sauté carrot, celery and onion for 10-15 minutes. Add to lentil mixture and continue to cook for an additional 30 minutes.




around and eating our way through Daytona one evening at Cracker Barrel and Krispy Kreme, we ran across the

think of what you would get if you crossed a Wal-Mart and a Wawa that was staffed with the most friendly individuals



Please call Mary Shaw, 522-5982 for your reservations. Please note that if you reserve and don't show, you'll still owe for your meal because we have to pay the restaurant.




