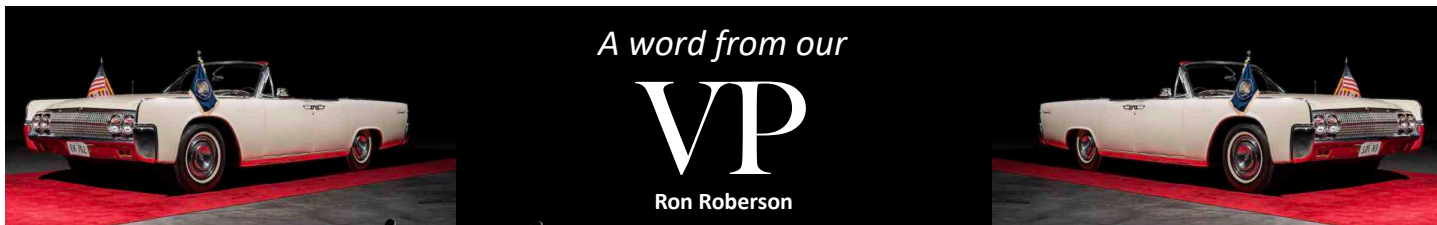

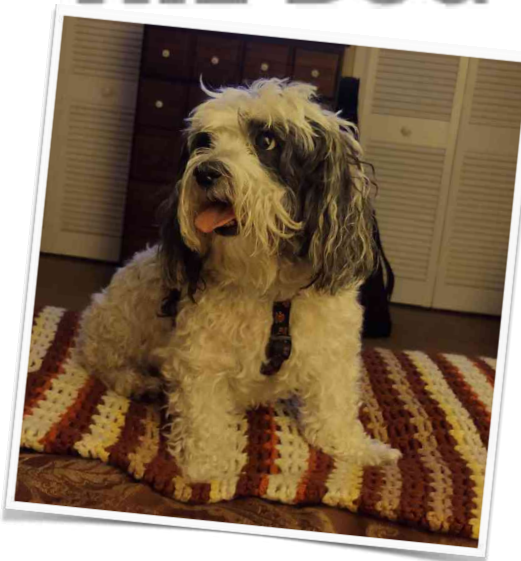

RUNNING ON EMPTY

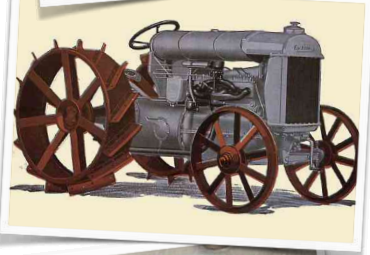
ANOTHER *Ford* PRODUCT

Most any member of Pin-MAR will know that our Mercantile garage at Heritage Village houses three old Ford cars; a 1925 Model T coupe, a '25 TT stake bed truck and a '28 Model A Phaeton. What you may not realize is that another Ford family product is on display back behind the Lowe Barn. A careful inspection of that rusted hulk of a tractor will uncover the name "Fordson" on the radiator grill. The Fordson tractor company was a company owned by Henry and Edsel Ford, and it began mass producing a cheap and lightweight model in 1917.

The year 1917 saw the Model T assembly line running at full tilt, with Ford entering a period of global dominance. All model Ts coming off the assembly line that year wore black paint, and all traces of brass brightwork were gone. The electric starter option was still two years away, so the Tin Lizzie was still hand cranked. The purchase of Lincoln was still five years away. Edsel Ford was the company president with Henry enjoying his "retirement" by continuing to micro-manage the company on a daily basis. With Henry's interest in farming, he knew the need for a tough and sturdy tractor, and his answer was the Fordson.

In the year 1917, WWI was raging in Europe, and the first orders went to the UK to aid in food production during the war. Fordson tractors were built in the US from 1917 through 1928, but they were produced in Cork, Ireland until 1933 and in England from 1933 to 1964. One of the largest markets was the Soviet Union, and some 250,000 were shipped there in the 1920s.

A look at the Park's rusting relic reveals much about the primitive century-old design. The cast iron seat had no upholstery or padding, and the large rear wheels had no tires. They got traction in the mud from an all-steel paddlewheel design.



The front axle is swivel-mounted to the frame at the center so as to allow maximum vertical movement at the wheels. The engine, rated at 20 horsepower, looks remarkably like that of a Model T Ford car.

Fordson began as a separate company, but it was rolled into the Ford Motor Company in 1920. In typical Ford fashion, the nimble Fordson tractor proved to be the first tractor that was cheaper to own than a horse, and it became the fore runner of the popular Ford Ferguson and N-model tractors of the 1930s, '40s and '50s. I don't know the entire history of the Park's relic, but it has been resting in place for the entire three decades or so that I have attended Heritage Village. At one point a roof was erected above it to slow the weathering, but it remains much as it was when I first spotted it years ago.

A few years back, Bob Croslin and I were walking the swap meet at Zephyr Hills, when Bob spotted a small toolbox with the Fordson logo. It was a little battered and had holes in the back where it was previously bolted to a tractor. I have a collection of Ford logo tools, but I had never found anything with the Fordson logo. I told Bob, if you don't buy that thing, I will, and he handed it to me. Today, I use the box to store spare parts for my lawn sprinkling system.

The Fordson tractor holds a special place in Ford history, being the first full purpose tractor to be built and sold by Henry. Our example in Heritage Village reveals many of the design features of this very early example of motorized farm equipment. Next time you are walking through the park, take a moment to look between the Lowe barn and the blacksmith shop to see this historical relic.

See you on the road. Let's do a tour to a retro farm real soon.

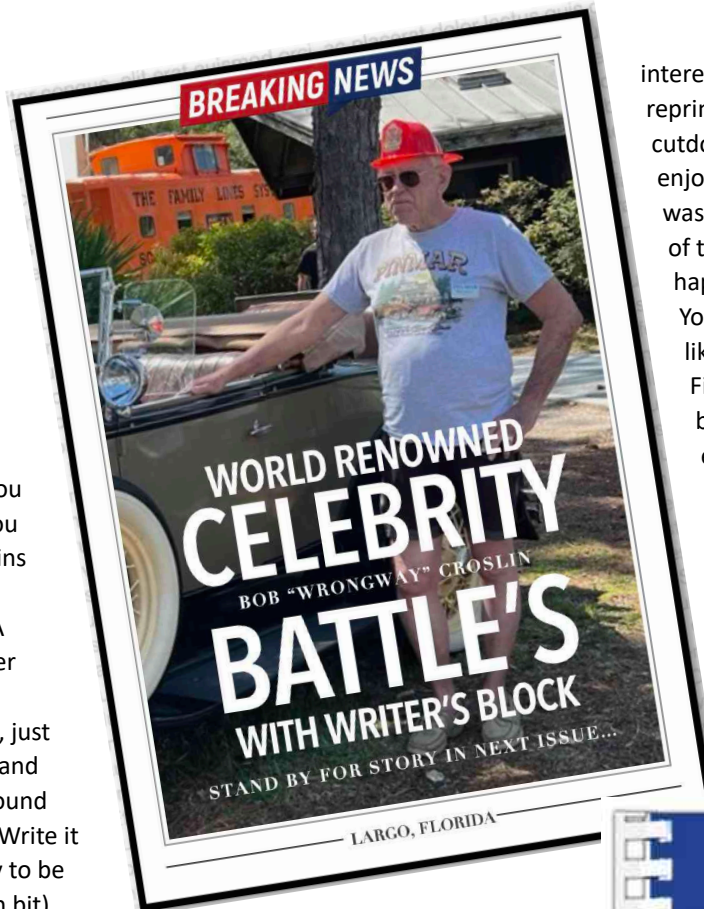
WRITER'S BLOCK?

But, do be careful because most of us working on old cars only know four letter words, so try to slip in a few five of six letter words if you know any. If not, ask your spouse. They might know some.

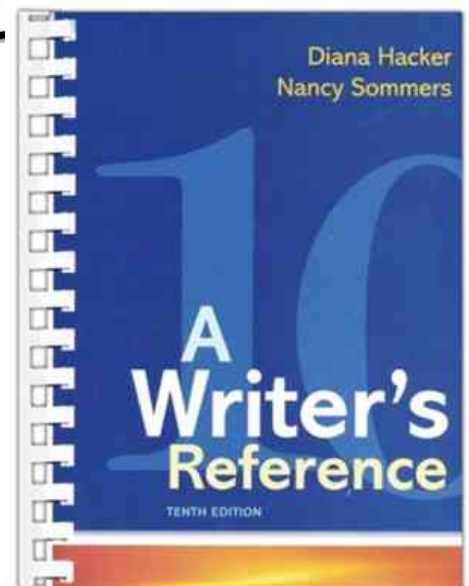

FAVORITE Family RECIPES RECIPE OF THE MONTH



3-Ingredient Pulled Pork

Only 3 ingredients to moist, flavorful pulled pork that can be prepared in minutes and cooked in a slow cooker.

Ingredients:

- (2 lb) pork tenderloin (pork shoulder or butt can also be used)
- 1 can (12 oz) root beer
- 1 bottle (18 oz) barbecue sauce
- 8 hamburger buns

Preparation:

Place the pork tenderloin in a slow cooker and pour the can of root beer over the meat. Cover and cook on low for 6 hours or until pork shreds easily with a fork.

Remove cooked pork to cutting board, and drain and discard the root beer. Shred pork and return it to the slow cooker. Pour the barbecue sauce over the pork and stir to combine. Serve immediately or keep warm in slow cooker until ready.

Serve on hamburger buns.

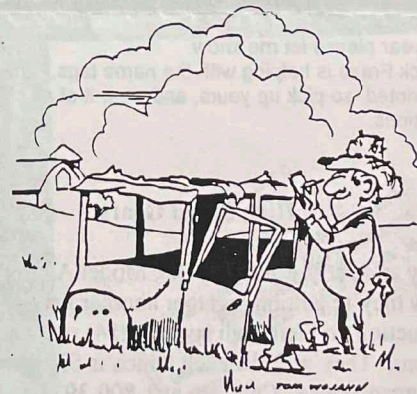

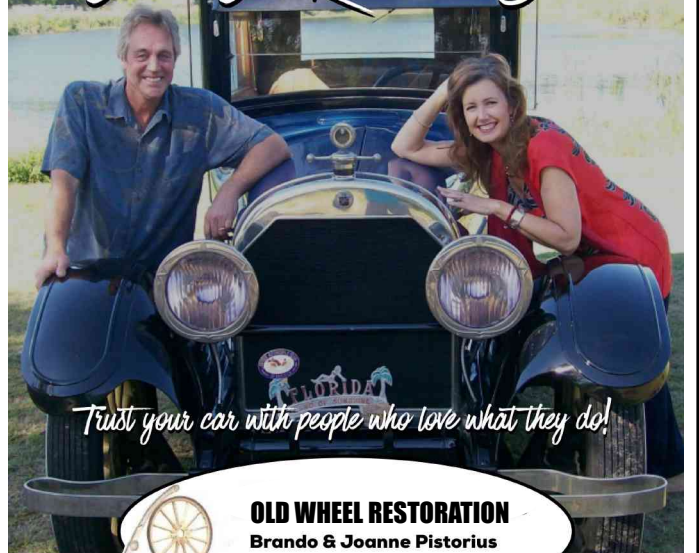

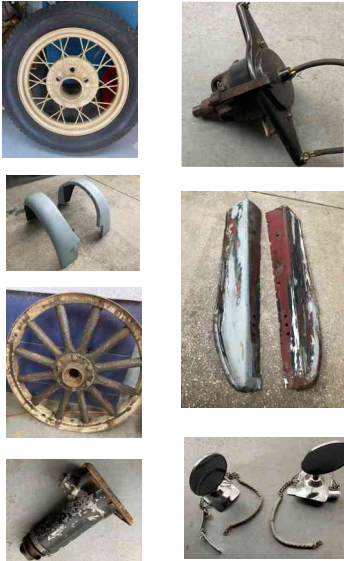
